

Case Study: Restoring Vision Through Speed and Scale

How Somaa Health Enabled a High-Impact Eye Care Collaboration in Mumbai

The Challenge

Cataracts are a leading cause of preventable blindness in India, especially among underserved communities, where access to timely surgery is often blocked by cost, low awareness, and healthcare gaps.

Somaa Health recognised the need for a coordinated intervention to bridge the gap between high-quality care providers and patients who often remain excluded from essential surgical care.

Partnership Overview

In recognition of Cataract Awareness Month (June), Somaa Health facilitated a focused collaboration between Reliance Foundation and R.J Sankara Eye Hospital Trust to deliver a high-impact cataract surgery initiative in Mumbai.

Reliance Foundation provided the financial support necessary to conduct 100 free cataract surgeries for patients who otherwise lacked access to timely and high quality treatment.

Somaa identified and partnered with Sankara Eye Hospital, a charitable institution known for its clinical excellence and community-focused care, to execute the surgeries.





Our Role

As the healthcare integrator, Somaa managed the initiative end to end:

- Mobilised funding through Reliance Foundation
- √ **Identified and onboarded** Sankara Eye Hospital for clinical execution
- Facilitated reporting and impact analysis
- Ensured operational alignment between funder and provider



Execution and Impact

The entire program was completed in just 9 days at Sankara Eye Hospital's Mumbai facility, where 100 cataract surgeries were provided free of cost. Each patient underwent thorough pre-surgical screening and post-operative follow-up to ensure safe recovery and lasting outcomes.

Among them was Bhagirathi Bhagwan Mali, a 60-year-old farmer from Bhiwandi Shelar. Living alone with limited income, she had struggled with blurred vision for over a year. After learning about the free camp through local outreach, she attended a screening, was diagnosed, and underwent successful surgery on June 26. Today, she's back to work with restored vision and renewed independence.

Stories like hers reflect the program's deeper impact, restoring not just sight, but stability and self-reliance.
